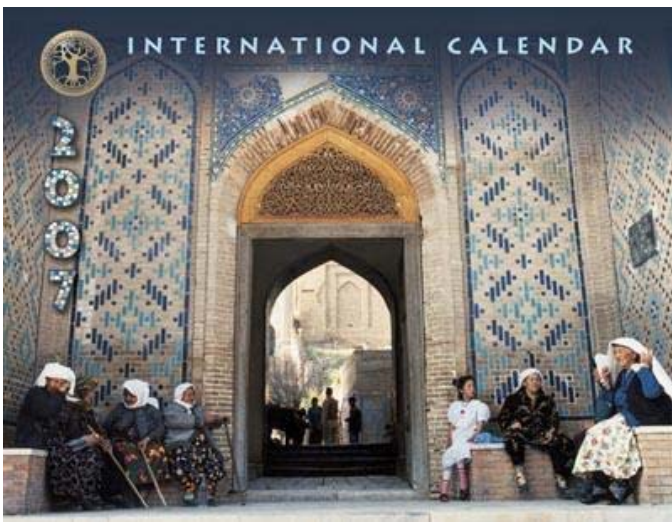

## **Volunteers needed**

**Mentoring:** The CRPCA board has placed our group's name in consideration for a pilot project where members of our group would mentor newly returned Peace Corps Volunteers (RPCVs). This joint project of Peace Corps and the National Peace Corps Association (NPCA) aims to support RPCVs in their first months back in the States, to build a constituency for Third Goal activities, and to strengthen connections between RPCVs and the established Peace Corps community.

Through face-to-face meetings and continued communication for the duration of the program, mentors will offer support and guidance for returning volunteers as they transition from Peace Corps service into educational programs or jobs. The pilot program will take place in three cities from January 2007 through June 2007 and will include an orientation at the beginning of the program for all mentors and mentees.

To support our application, we need at least 15 member RPCVs to express their willingness to serve as mentors if Portland is selected. If you would be interested in participating, please let us know soon by e-mailing [rireland88@yahoo.com](mailto:rireland88@yahoo.com).

## **NPCA to change membership options**

At the National Peace Corps Association (NPCA) meeting in D.C. this past September, RPCV group leaders voted to recommend the following changes to NPCA's membership options. These would still have to be approved by the NPCA board, but they could be implemented in 2007.

- All NPCA memberships would be individual, single-year. The family and multi-year membership options would no longer be available. Dues would remain \$35 per year.
- NPCA and affiliate group memberships would be à-la-carte. NPCA members could continue to belong to CRPCA or another geographic or country-of-service group (for annual dues of \$15 or more, depending on the group), but this would be optional and arranged through those groups.
- In a boon to affiliate group treasurers all over the country, no money would change hands between NPCA and affiliate groups.

We must stress that nothing has changed yet. If your NPCA and/or CRPCA membership is due for renewal, we continue to encourage membership in both groups. NPCA does a great job of advocating for a more effective Peace Corps and its Third Goal initiatives and publications are top-notch. See [our website](#) for more information on membership options. We are saddened to pass along the news of the death of Charlotte Utting, who died peacefully on October 7 with her family around her. In addition to serving twice as a Peace Corps Volunteer (Senegal 1980-82 and Cameroon 1989-90, when she was a so-called "senior PCV"), she was also a Peace Corps recruiter in Seattle, leader of the Washington State Peace Corps Association and Northwest regional leader.
