ADVOCACY: PEACE CORPS 101

"101" represents the number of lawmakers who took affirmative action in support of increased Peace Corps funding during NPCA's fourth National Day of Action.

In the United States Senate, 28 lawmakers signed a letter circulated by Senators Chris Dodd (D-CT) and Norm Coleman (R-MN), urging a robust appropriation for Peace Corps in Fiscal Year 2009.

In the House of Representatives, the request was more specific. All five RPCV Congressmen led by Chris Shays (R-CT) circulated a letter urging \$400 Million for Peace Corps in FY 09. Even though this is significantly above President Bush's budget request, 73 Congressmen/women agreed to sign onto the letter.

"This was clearly the largest mobilization yet during and after our Day of Action", said NPCA Advocacy Coordinator Jonathan Pearson, who added the number of signers of House and Senate letters were the highest ever, representing a 43% increase over the number of signatures from similar letters last March.
